In addition to patrol services, most K-9s are dual purposed in either narcotics or explosive detection, or tracking. S.E.A.L.'s specially-trained Officers and their K-9 partners can be one of the most effective and productive security tools available to dissuade, discourage, and prevent crime. In the interest of safety, we ask that clients and residents do not approach the K-9 or attempt to pet them. We appreciate everyone's support.

7:02 P.M. Officer on patrol noted Reveille Park had extremely poor lighting.



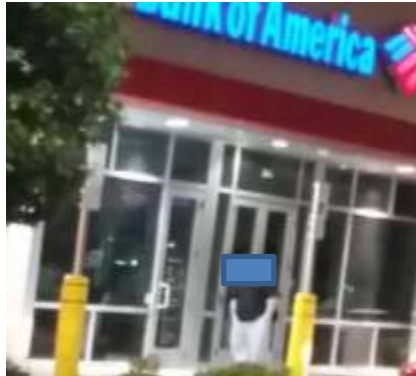
Wednesday, November 9

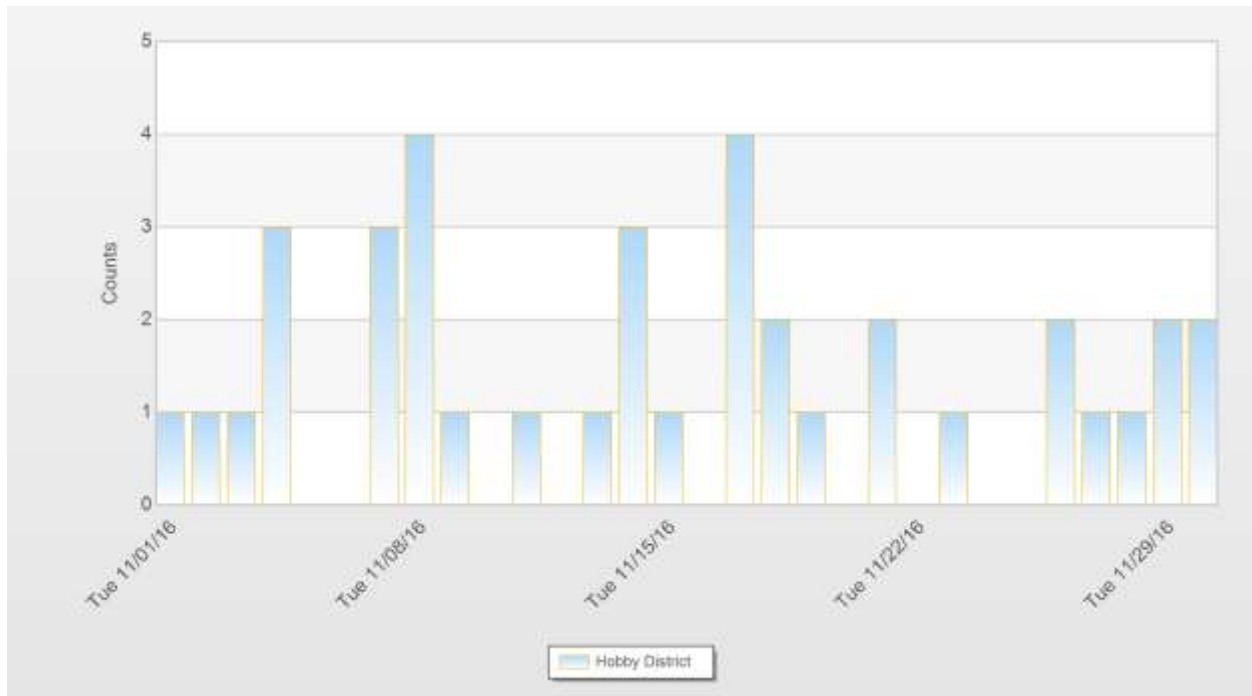
7:00 P.M. Officer on patrol at Robert C. Stewart Park advised a male sitting in his vehicle that the park was closed. He left without incident.
